Nurses are screening students vision/hearing and BMI. Through the Lyons Club and other organizations free eye exams and eye glasses are available for students.

Nurse Tara Dorrough reported about the new law that requires an immunization report on our VBSD website list the percentage and number of students who are not immunized and have exemptions.

Roy Kendrick, Child Nutrition Director, provided October menus and informed the committee of the following:

- The Food Truck will be making its way to the middle schools soon.
- The fresh fruit and vegetables grants was approved at Central and King but not at Butterfield and Tate.

Jenks Smith made a motion to approve menus; Beck Goerig seconded the motion, menus approved.

Drew Cone reported about the progress of all the Joint Use Agreement grants at Butterfield, Tate, City Heights, the Boys and Girls Club, and Rena. This semester's staff wellness event will be a cornhole tournament. The topic of vaping and e-cigs was discussed with the new ordinance in our City being passed, which states any person under the age of 21 caught vaping or with a vaping device may be fined through the court system.

Kolby Snellenberger, principal at Butterfield, asked the question if our district has considered purchasing vaping detectors for bathrooms.
