Progress Toward Goals



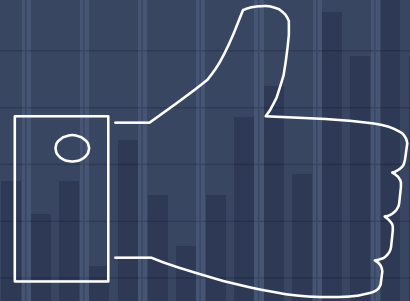
Multiple Measures of Progress

- Ongoing classroom assessments for literacy, writing, and math

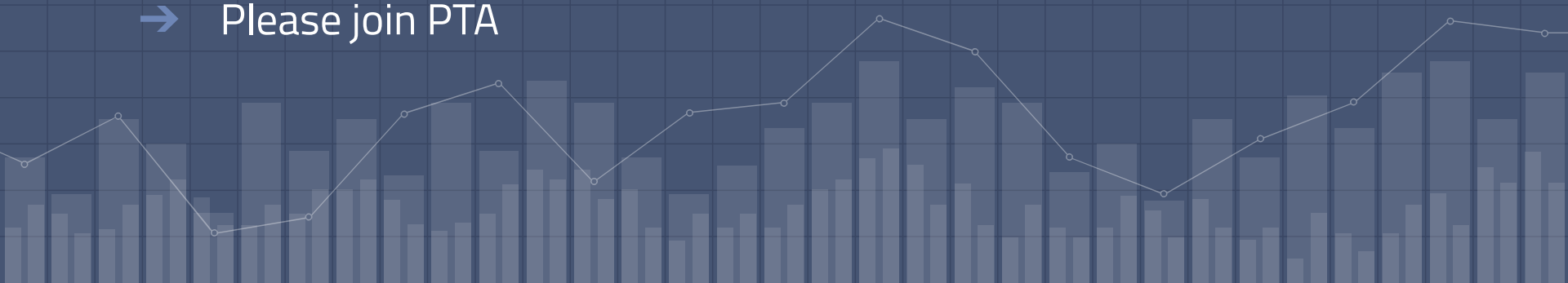


In the 2019-2020 school year, events related to COVID-19 caused a substantial disruption to the education system. Because of these events, some items typically included in accountability and reporting are not available.
