Whether the teacher meets the state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.








Istation Reading April 2021

- Encourage students to participate in online enrichment provided by the school such as EPIC and ST Math.
- Participate in school wide activities.

- Central Elementary (CES) has 14% of the staff with an advanced degree.
- All teachers have been training in R.I.S.E. (Reading Initiative for Student Excellence).
- A handful of Central's certified personnel have been trained in Sheltered Instruction Observation Protocol (SIOP) training.

All faculty members met the 36 hrs. of professional development requirement from the State last year and were considered highly qualified teachers.

Central Elementary Goals for 202-20:

 Increase percent of students at levels 3, 4, 5 in Istation Math and Reading by 5% as compared to 2020-21 April ISIP scores.

2. Increase ACT Reading scores by 5% as compared to 2020–21 ACT Aspire scores.

Why?

- Reading skills are applied across all subject areas.
- Foundations of mathematical concepts are crucial at a young age.

HOW WILL WE GET THERE?

Improving Istation Math and Reading Scores

- Adding incentives for students to score well on and improve scores on Istation assessments.
- Provide teachers with decodable texts to use with students
- Provide Professional Development on using Science of Reading strategies to improve reading skills
- Use MobyMax online program in conjunction with Istation as additional intervention for students in mathematics.

Improving ACT Reading Scores

- Targeted classroom instruction
- After-School Tutoring (as COVID allows)
- Implementing Jennifer Serravallo assessments and professional development for teachers
